The Prayer of Freedom - Master Class Session 5: Covering and Questions

Authority and covering -- protecting loved ones

Eph 5:23 (NIV) - For the husband is the head of the wife as <u>Christ is the head</u> of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior.

Protection of others

Adam and Eve: Gen 3:1-7a (NIV) - ¹ Now the serpent... said to the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must not eat from any tree in the garden'? " ² The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat fruit from the trees in the garden, ³ but God did say, 'You must not eat fruit from the tree that is in the middle of the garden, and you must not touch it, or you will die.'" ⁴ "You will not certainly die," the serpent said ... ⁶ When the woman saw that the fruit of the tree was good for food and pleasing to the eye... <u>she took some and ate</u> <u>it</u>. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, *and he ate i*t. ⁷ <u>Then</u> the eyes of both of them were opened...

David and the census - 1 Chr 21:1-14 (NIV) - ¹ Satan <u>rose up against Israel</u> and incited David to take a census of Israel... ⁷ This command was also evil in the sight of God; so <u>he punished Israel</u>. ⁸ Then David said to God, "<u>I have</u> <u>sinned</u> greatly by doing this..." ⁹ The LORD said to. ... ¹⁰ ... David... '<u>I am giving</u> <u>you three options</u>. Choose one of them for me to carry out against you... [*God gives options*] ... ¹³ David said... "... Let me fall into the hands of the LORD, for his mercy is very great; but do not let me fall into human hands." ¹⁴ So the LORD sent a plague on Israel, and <u>seventy thousand men of Israel</u> <u>fell dead</u>...

King Jehoshaphat (good): **2 Chr 17:3-4, 10 (NLT)** - ³ The LORD was with Jehoshaphat because he followed the example of his father's early years and did not worship the images of Baal. ⁴ He sought his father's God and obeyed his commands instead of following the evil practices of the kingdom of Israel. ¹⁰ Then the fear of the LORD fell over all the surrounding kingdoms so that none of them wanted to declare war on Jehoshaphat.

King Joash (wicked): **2 Chr 24:17-24 (NLT)** - ¹⁷ But after Jehoiada's death, the leaders of Judah came and bowed before King Joash... ¹⁸ <u>They decided to</u> <u>abandon the Temple of the LORD... and worshiped Asherah poles and idols</u> <u>instead</u>! Because of this sin, divine anger fell on Judah and Jerusalem... ²³ In the spring of the year the Aramean army marched against Joash. They invaded Judah and Jerusalem and <u>killed all the leaders of the nation</u>... ²⁴ <u>Although the Arameans attacked with only a small army, the LORD helped</u> <u>them conquer the much larger army of Judah</u>...

King Jotham (good): **2 Chr 27:2-6 (NLT)** - ² Jotham did what was pleasing in the LORD's sight... <u>But the people continued in their corrupt ways</u>. ³ Jotham rebuilt the upper gate of the Temple of the LORD... ⁵ Jotham went to war against the Ammonites and conquered them. Over the next three years he

received from them an <u>annual tribute of 7,500 pounds of silver, 50,000</u> <u>bushels of wheat, and 50,000 bushels of barley</u>. ⁶ King Jotham <u>became</u> <u>powerful because he was careful to live in obedience to the LORD his God</u>

Repentance for others

Num 30:3-12 (NIV) - ³ "If a young woman makes a vow to the LORD or a pledge under oath while she is still living at her father's home... ⁵ ... <u>if her</u> <u>father refuses to let her fulfill the vow or pledge</u>... then all her vows and pledges will become invalid... ¹⁰ "But suppose a woman is married and living in her husband's home when she makes a vow or binds herself with a pledge... ¹² ... <u>if her husband refuses to accept it</u>... her vow or pledge will be nullified, and the LORD will forgive he.

Job 1:2-3, 6-10 (NIV) - ² [Job] had seven sons and three daughters, ³ and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants... ⁶ One day the angels came to present themselves before the LORD, and <u>Satan</u> also came with them... ⁸ Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job? ... a man who fears God and shuns evil." ⁹ "Does Job fear God for nothing?" Satan replied. ¹⁰ "<u>Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has</u>? You have blessed the work of his hands, so that his flocks and herds are spread throughout the land.

Job 1:4-5 (NIV) - ⁴ His sons used to hold feasts in their homes on their birthdays, and they would invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. ⁵ When a period of feasting had run its course, Job would make arrangements for them to be purified. Early in the morning he would <u>sacrifice a burnt offering for each of them</u>, thinking, "Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." <u>This was Job's regular custom</u>.

About the prayer How to do it

Why it is setup as it is

Read it - Mat 6:9-13 (NIV) - ⁹ "This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, ¹⁰ your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹ Give us today our daily bread. ¹² And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. ¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.'

Repeat it -

1. <u>Persistence</u>: Luk 18:1-8 (NIV) - ¹ Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should <u>always pray and not give up</u>. ² He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. ³ And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, '<u>Grant me justice against my adversary</u>.' ⁴ "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, ⁵ yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'" ⁶ And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. ⁷ And <u>will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night</u>? Will he keep putting them off? ⁸ I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly. However, when the Son of Man comes, <u>will he find faith on the earth</u>?"

2. <u>Multiple commands</u>: Mar 5:1-13 (ESV) - ¹ They came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gerasenes. ² And when Jesus had stepped out of the boat, immediately there met him out of the tombs a man with an unclean spirit... ⁵ Night and day among the tombs and on the mountains he was always crying out and cutting himself with stones. ⁶ And when he saw Jesus from afar, he ran and fell down before him. ⁷ And crying out with a loud voice, he said, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I adjure you by God, do not torment me." ⁸ For he was **saying** to him, "Come out of the man, you unclean spirit!" ⁹ And Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" <u>He replied</u>, "My name is Legion, for we are many." ¹⁰ And <u>he begged him earnestly</u> not to send them out of the country. ¹¹ Now a great herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, ¹² and they begged him, saying, "Send us to the pigs; let us enter them." ¹³ So <u>he gave them permission</u>. And the unclean spirits came out and entered the pigs; and the herd, numbering about two thousand, rushed down the steep bank into the sea and drowned in the sea.
